At Mary Valley State College, our **2026 Annual Implementation Plan (AIP)** is designed to enhance student learning outcomes by focusing on **differentiation, school improvement, and high-quality curriculum delivery**. Through a commitment to **systematic curriculum implementation** and **effective pedagogical practices**, we aim to provide every student with engaging and meaningful learning experiences. This plan aligns with the **Australian Curriculum (Version 9)** and the **P-12 Curriculum, Assessment, and Reporting Framework (CARF)** to ensure a consistent, evidence-based approach to teaching and learning.

A key priority for 2026 is the implementation of an engaging **curriculum** that meets the achievement standards of the Australian Curriculum. Our goal is to maintain a benchmark of **90% A–C and 40% A–B** in these core subjects. To achieve this, we will strengthen collaborative curriculum planning, embed a structured **moderation process (M1–M4)**, and develop a **whole-school approach to differentiation**. These strategies will ensure that all students, regardless of their learning needs, have access to high-quality, **tailored instruction and support**.

The **Marking Guides** will play a central role in our assessment and feedback processes. By using **explicit success criteria**, students will develop a clear understanding of their current achievement levels and the steps needed for improvement. Teachers will embed **learning walls, exemplars, and feedback strategies** to empower students to take ownership of their learning. Leaders will support this process through **targeted professional development, classroom walkthroughs, and regular data discussions** to ensure alignment with the curriculum and effective differentiation practices.

Through **ongoing reflection and data analysis**, we will refine our approaches to support the diverse needs of our students. By fostering a culture of **collaboration, high expectations, and continuous improvement**, we are committed to ensuring **every student achieves success** in 2026 and beyond.

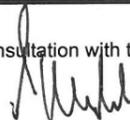
